# Call for applications Academic Year 2024/25

The University of Pisa announces for the Academic Year 2024/25 a public competition, open to non-EU citizens not resident in Italy, for admission to the Master's Degree in Cybersecurity (Laurea Magistrale, class LM-66).

The competition aims at admitting non-EU applicants, who must apply and undergo an evaluation procedure. The submitted documentation will be assessed by the Master's Degree Evaluation Committee (EC). Shortlisted applicants will be eligible for admission and ranked.

The outcome of the evaluation will be made available to applicants in the site for application only at the very end of the evaluation procedure.

## **Admission requirements**

Applicants must either hold:

- a Bachelor of Science, or equivalent first-cycle degree, obtained abroad after the completion of a three-year (minimum) course of study, in Computer Science or in Computer Engineering or any other degree providing a suitable background in both mathematics and computer science or computer engineering. The admission of candidates holding a qualification issued in a non-EU country will be subject to verification and recognition of legitimacy by the Italian deputy diplomatic authorities.
- It is strictly required for applicants to hold a CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) equal to or above 75% of the maximum grades (e.g., 3 in a scale of 4, or 15 in a scale of 20; please note that no institution-specific grade-to-percentage conversion rule is considered for this purpose. The CGPA must be computed on all the exams (including elective ones) over all the years of the first-cycle degree and must be substantiated by the submitted official documentation. Any application with a CGPA below the 75% threshold will be automatically excluded from the competition.
- any Italian Laurea degree of classes L-8 or L-31, or with:
  - at least 18 CFUs taken from learning activities in the SSD sectors: MAT/\*, FIS/\*

at least 36 CFUs taken from learning activities in the SSD sectors: ING-INF/01, ING-INF/03, ING-INF/05, INF/01.

Knowledge of the English language, comparable to the **level B2** of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages, is also required.

## **Application procedure and due documentation**

Before applying please note that the result of the selection of the candidates will be available only at the very end of the procedure, as indicated below.

Applicants shall apply online at https://applymscenglish.unipi.it.

In the application form, applicants must include:

- a declaration of knowledge of the English language, specifying the duration of studies and the type of certification held;
- certification of the academic degree they possess, with an indication of the legal duration of the course (at least three years), together with a copy of the degree certificate and transcripts (translated to English or Italian);
- a copy of a valid passport;
- a copy of their complete Curriculum Vitae et Studiorum covering their education program, as well as any other relevant cultural and professional experience that might help the EC to evaluate the applicant.

Applicants may also include other documents (e.g., letters of reference, other certificates). All documents must be in Adobe pdf format.

Applications missing any of the required documents are not considered valid and will not be processed further. Applications cannot be integrated after the call deadline.

## Application deadlines and selection schedule

Applications are evaluated in two rounds. Please note that the result of the selection of the candidates will be available only at the very end of the procedure, namely after March 17<sup>th</sup> for the first round and after May 19<sup>th</sup> for the second round. The results will be available directly on the portal for applications; note that "not admitted" or "non ammesso" here means that the application of the candidate did not pass the evaluation and then the candidate is not admitted to the M.Sc. In Cybersecurity.

#### **FIRST ROUND**

- applications are open from November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023 to January 21<sup>th</sup>, 2024, 12:00 pm (GMT) [strict]
- interviews of selected candidates are scheduled from February 5<sup>th</sup>, 2024 to February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2024 [tentative]
- notifications of admission are delivered by February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024
- notifications of rejection will not be sent by e-mail, but they will be published in the portal by February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024.
- Note that the results of the selection will not be available before February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2024 and, in general, no communications will be sent before the end of the selection process.

#### **SECOND ROUND**

- applications are open from March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2024 to March 31<sup>th</sup>, 2024, 12:00pm (GMT) [strict]
- interviews are scheduled from April 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024 to April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024 [tentative]
- notifications of admission are delivered by April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024

- notifications of rejection will not be sent by e-mail, but they will be published in the portal by April 30th.
- Note that the results of the selection will not be available before April 30<sup>th</sup> In general, no communications will be sent before the end of the selection process.

Prospective applicants are therefore encouraged to apply at their earliest convenience. Furthermore, note that applicants admitted in the second round will not be able to apply for the Unipi scholarships (<a href="https://www.unipi.it/contribution">https://www.unipi.it/contribution</a>) (but they will still be able to apply for the other scholarships, see Fees and Financial Support below).

## **Evaluation procedure**

The documentation submitted by applicants will be evaluated by the Evaluation Committee (EC), consisting of information Engineering and Computer Science professors. The committee will assess the applicants' background and education, their potential skills and attitude to attend an interdisciplinary and innovative educational programme, and grade them on a scale of 60 points. Applicants scoring less than 42 points will be rejected. Applicants scoring 42 or more will be shortlisted for an interview.

Applicants shortlisted for the interview will be informed via e-mail (sent to the account indicated in the application form) about the time and date of the interview. Interviews will be held through videoconference using Skype. The applicant shall provide the proper settings to carry out the video interview and exhibit the ID submitted in the online application. Applicants not attending the interview in their scheduled slot will be excluded.

Applicants will be interviewed by the EC, who will evaluate their motivation, expectations, and technical skills, as well as their mastering of the English language. Interviews will be graded on a scale of 40 points. Shortlisted applicants scoring less than 28 points will be rejected. Those scoring 28 points or more will be eligible for admission.

## What to do upon admission

Admitted applicants will first need to confirm by email their intent to pre-enrol, by replying to the email notifying their admission. Upon confirmation of their intent to pre-enrol, the admitted applicants will receive a formal admission letter by email. The letter must be included in the pre-enrolment documentation to be unloaded on the UNIVERSITALY website so as to be submitted to the Italian Embassy/Consulate - by a deadline which is to be verified by the students - and to apply for a Student Visa. Please note that completing the pre-enrolment and Student Visa procedures might take several weeks, depending on the Italian Embassy/Consulates, and that the University of Pisa cannot liaise with the Embassy/Consulate on your behalf under any circumstance. Students that have successfully pre-enrolled on Universitaly and have obtained their Student Visa will be able to come to Italy, where they will follow the procedure to enroll at the University of Pisa. Admitted students must also inform the EC of their final Student Visa status by sending an email to our international office (international@ing.unipi.it).

## **Fees and Financial Support**

University fees are to be paid on each academic year. They are determined by the Board of Directors on a yearly basis, and normally announced in the month of June for the following academic year (in the academic year 2023/24, they ranged from € 356 to € 2,400 per year, depending on the student's country of origin). Please note that there are several bodies that can provide financial support to international students:

- This Master's Degree programme will also participate to the "Invest your Talent in Italy" scholarship
